DIPLOMA DESIGNATIONS:

Scholar Diploma Designation

In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must meet the following requirements:

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra II.
- Earn 1 credit in statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course.
- Earn 1 credit in chemistry or physics.
- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to chemistry or physics.
- Earn 2 credits in the same world language.
- Earn at least 1 credit in AP or a dual enrollment course.
- Takes the respective AP assessment; and
- Earns the minimum score to earn college credit.

Standard Diploma Designation

- Meet the standard high school diploma requirements.

State University System (SUS)

Admission into Florida’s public universities is competitive. Prospective students should complete a rigorous curriculum in high school and apply to more than one university to increase their chance for acceptance. To qualify to enter one of Florida’s public universities, a first time-in-college student must meet the following minimum requirements:

- High school graduation with a standard diploma
- Admission test scores
- 16 credits of approved college preparatory academic courses
- 4 English (3 with substantial writing)
- 4 Mathematics (Algebra I level and above)
- 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
- 3 Social Science
- 2 World Language (sequential, in the same language)
- 2 approved electives
